O little town of Bethlehem

That's strange. The Welsh translation of this carol describes Bethlehem as being quiet rather than little, giving an impression of a calm and tranquillity.

But would Bethlehem have been quiet and calm?

Surely the problems faced today would also be found there.

Because we know that people are people, no matter when they are born.

No doubt there would have been homes with people suffering physical or mental illness, causing pain and worry.
Homes where domestic violence meant tears, bruises and fear.

Some people in the Bethlehem area would be facing anguish, possibly crying out in despair because of their inability to escape some personal problem or break free from a certain pattern of life.

Bethlehem would not have been quiet with the sound of soldiers walking the streets any more than the streets of Ukraine, Gaza and so many other places today.

No doubt stomachs would be rumbling as a result of hunger, and bodies shivering because of a lack of shelter and warm clothing.

O little / O quiet town of Bethlehemyet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light.

The everlasting Light, a sign of new hope,
The Light promised over the centuries by the prophets.
The Light of God himself, a weak baby, yet a baby with God's power in his hands.

This Light shines today, helping those who are ill, those who suffer as a result of violence, those in need, those bowed down with worry, those without hope, those living in situations of violence and conflict.
